Locality Hub Project – Central Bedfordshire

• Central Bedfordshire Council is moving towards co-located services across the county



- Dunstable, Leighton Buzzard and Biggleswade are the first formalised hubs with two further hubs in development that will launch in 2018
- CBC wants to understand the services for CYPF that are provided by voluntary and community organisations within each of these areas
- Work done (in December) Research into organisations that provide services in Dunstable – compilation of a list of organisations and the services they offer

Safeguarding Project - Bedford Borough

This project is being supported by Bedford Borough Safeguarding Children Board.



Aim: To work with voluntary sector organisations to ascertain what safeguarding procedures are in place and how staff/volunteers are trained in safeguarding.



Safeguarding Project - Bedford Borough

Work done (since September):

- Identified and researched potential organisations to visit
- Developed a spreadsheet containing details of each organisation
- Researched safeguarding standards, procedures and checklists
- Developed a safeguarding checklist
- Developed safeguarding resources
- Produced information sheets

It is hoped that this work will confirm the good practice that is already in place within each organisation and also identify any gaps in safeguarding provision.





VOCypf communications
