# 3. Minutes of last Forum meeting (30-06-2022) and matters arising

# 4. Information Exchange

## **BPHA - Amanda**

- Super busy with referrals.
- Current recruiting for new staff.
- £500,000 of funding has been secured to assist BPHA clients with rent arrears. Please do refer any clients to the service if you feel they are eligible.

# **GUHG - Elliott**

- The service remains very busy, with referrals continuing to increase.
- A new member staff starting after Easter, replacing a member of staff who left.
- Increasing service charges, due to the cost of energy, are an issue for some residents.
- Recruiting for an Apprentice Debt Advisor shortly.

## **BRCC - Justine**

• New Community Agent will commence work in April, focusing on those in town centre area affected by the cost of living crisis.

## CBC Tenancy Support Team - Pat

- The service is very busy, with around 30 referrals a month.
- The lack of a furniture scheme in the Dunstable/South Bedfordshire area is an ongoing challenge.

## Salvation Army - Karen

- One of the volunteers at Money Advice at St Andrews is now volunteering at the service.
- The service is currently recruiting to allow it to move from 3 to 5 days a week.

## Bedford Community Self-help Group - Paulette

• Limited activity currently due to venue issues

## Citizens Advice Bedford - Fran

- Welcome to Fran!
- 150 new debt clients in February, which is double the expected number.
- Dedicated advisor at Bedford Foodbank in place, which is working well.
- Volunteer team has been increased from 12 to 20 volunteers.
- Keen to hear from organisations who want to work in partnership.

# Bedford Borough Libraries - Georgia

- The warm spaces initiative is almost finished, but libraries are still there as a community hub.
- Numerous children's events being held to encourage early engagement with the library service.
- Ongoing IT sessions in the libraries to offer people support and guidance.
- Happy to hear from others who wish to promote their services in the libraries.

## Macmillan - Sam

- Current operating with 40-50 people waiting list, which equates to a 4 week waiting period.
- Sam is going part-time, so look out for a 2-day week post being advertised soon.
- A new full-time post is also due to be advertised soon.
- The service can still offer to small grants for individuals.

## Bedford Foodbank – Sarah

• The service has seen a 69% increase in demand, which it is currently managing, but that may be difficult to sustain in the long term.

## BRASS - Brian

- Drop in and advice sessions, English lessons, and social activities all continued be offered.
- Brian is keeping a close watch on the establishment of an asylum 'hotel' near Sharnbrook, and the support that residents might need. There are limited local services nearby, and almost no public transport links to/from the site.

## MIND - Debra

- The peer support groups across the county are very popular.
- Crisis café open every day in in Bedford, and part time centres are opening or already open in Biggleswade and Houghton Regis (but no longer at Flitwick).
- Opening soon Young Person's Sanctuary aimed at ages 14-17yrs, open 4pm 10pm, at locations at Bedford, Luton, and Leighton Buzzard.

## Hightown Housing Association - Melanie

• The Financial Inclusion and Tenancy Sustainability Team are working hard to cope with demand.

## Citizens Advice Leighton Linslade - Kash

- The service consists of two full-time and five part-time staff.
- Volunteer numbers are only 50% of pre-pandemic numbers.
- More clients are presenting with multiple issues, which is very resource intensive.

## Autism Beds – Wendy

 Wendy continues to support Autism Bedfordshire clients to claim any benefits and any other support that they might be entitled to.

# QPCO - Chiara

- A number of projects operating, including:
- Domestic abuse project providing the gap between someone leaving abuse and finding alternative accommodation. Often the service only needs to be involved for a day or two.
- Community Interpreting Service, which is phone based.
- Fitness classes at Kings Oak school for all ages and abilities.
- Drop in sessions with Carers in Bedfordshire.

# 6. BAF Training

BAF will be planning some training courses in 2023. The first courses will be in the spring, and then some further courses will be held in autumn. We will use a pool of experienced trainers to run the courses. The training programme will be self-funding. Full day courses will cost £75. Our local courses are very good value compared to the £200+ cost of most courses currently on offer in London.

We have also applied to Beds and Luton Community Foundation for some funding from the Frank Branston Charitable Trust to help pay for some of the training programme. If this grant application is successful, we will be able to reduce the course fees to £25.
