#### 3. Information Exchange

- Drop-in and advice sessions, English lessons, and social activities all continued be offered.
- BRASS recently celebrated its 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary with a picnic.
- The Refugees Week football tournament was very successful.
- A local support group has formed to support the asylum 'hotel' near Sharnbrook.

#### Citizens Advice Bedford - Fran

- The service has been expanding its outreach into all urban wards, and is about to trial the use of the library bus service to reach into the rural areas of the Borough.
- Two new money advisors and two energy advisors will soon be in place.

#### **Bedford Foodbank - Sarah**

- The service has seen a 36% increase in demand, with 2,000 people a month being supported.

# Update on BAF projects and activities

# **BAF** training

BAF applied for some funding for a training programme from BCLF (from the Frank Branston Trust) earlier this year. Unfortunately, this bid was unsuccessful.

As BAF had planned to run a training programme in the spring, we therefore went ahead with charging full fees for the courses. We decided to increase the fees this year as our training fees had remained unchanged for 9 years. The new fees for members are £75 for paid staff, and £40 for volunteers - which are still very low-cost fees for specialist, professional training.

There are 3 courses in the spring programme, which are BAF's first face-to-face training courses since before the Covid pandemic.

The break-even figure for each course is 8 attendees. So bookings above that figure will bring in a surplus for Advice Bedfordshire and BAF. As the bookings have been very good, a much needed surplus will be made from this programme.
